



- Focus: providing a cross-national comparison regarding juvenile delinquency based on the ISRD3-study findings
- Research Focus II: Feelings and Perceptions of (In)Security and Crime
- Cover: Croatia, Slovenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia,
 Macedonia, Kosovo and Turkey, (Romania and Hungary)
 - Balkans lacks basic research on juvenile delinquency; cross-national quantitative surveys in the region
 - History; culture; similar patterns of perception and behaviour; unstableness; very high degree of dissatisfaction; low level of trust in political institutions






- 2 levels: informal control theory and ISRD3

How do indicators play a role in juvenile delinquency control?






Indicators

- 1. Economy unemployment rate among young people; poverty level; average year to which young people live with their parents; mobility of young people
- 2. EU Membership- perspective in society
- 3. Religion, cultural value
- 4. Education- system; perception
- 5. Society- invest
- 6. Impact of the war and refuges
- 7. Migration...






- First time participating in the ISRD3 study
- City based sample: Zagreb and Varaždin
- Data collection:
 - First round: between April and May 2013,
 Second round: January 2014
- Data entering: end of May 2014
- Target group: 7th, 8th grade of primary school and 1st grade of secondary school (age range 12-16 years)
- Questionnaire: paper-and-pencil







• total sample (1744) and distribution by city and gender:








age and grade:



- relationship between parental attachment and control over the children, and it's influence on criminal activity of the juveniles
- parental attachment scale (Cronbach's Alpha= 0.72): concerning how well juveniles get along with their mother/father, how easily they can get emotional support or care from their parents and weather they would feel very bad disappointing them
- parent control scale (Cronbach's Alpha= 0.86)- three dimensions: First is parent knowledge about where their children are, what they are doing, and with what friends are they staying; second is parental supervision over the children; third is child disclosure to parents





- relationship between children's attachment to school and deviant phenomena in school, and it's influence on criminal activity of the juveniles
- school attachment scale (Cronbach's Alpha= 0.76): "If I had to move I would miss my school; most mornings I like going to school; I like my school; our classes are interesting"
- school disorganization scale (Cronbach's Alpha= 0.70): "There is a lot of stealing; there is a lot of fighting; there is a lot of vandalism; and there is a lot of drug use in my school"
